WELCOME TO THE COMMUNITY 101 RESOURCE BINDER!

Purpose of the Resource Binder:

To provide you with information about resources in the county that will help you plan and prepare your return to the community.

How is the Resource Binder Organized?

This resource binder provides a partial listing of service and support services that are available in the local county. There are sections for employment, education, housing, medical and behavioral health services, public benefits, legal services, food and clothing, social support, transportation, and miscellaneous services. For each listing, there is an address, telephone number, hours of operation, and often a short description.

How to Search the Resource Binder?

Search by topic and within a topic for the services that match your needs or interests. If for example, you want information about employment and you have a physical disability, see pages in the employment section that describe agencies providing employment services to people with disabilities.

To search more effectively once you're released, write down the names and addresses of web-based search resources, specifically: NJHelps (<http://www.njhelps.org/>) and 2-1-1: I Need Help (<http://www.nj211.org/search.cfm>). These are very helpful search sites that can target the service agencies that can best respond to you, as well as provide you with copies of applications and guidance on completing them.

Warning:

The service community is constantly changing – agencies move, people switch jobs, application forms and procedures are modified, and eligibility requirements change. We did our best to provide you with accurate information but it becomes dated as soon as the ink is dry on the paper. For this reason, it is important to write down information about many different agencies when using this binder and make sure you copy down the name, address, and telephone number of the agency. When you are released, check this information by using the local yellow pages or better yet visiting your local library (which has public access to computers). More and more information is available on the internet and it is organized in ways that make your search easier and faster.

The Resource Center is New Jersey Association of Correction's oldest non-residential program, and serves as a **walk-in center for ex-offenders**. The goal of the Resource Center is to assist clients in remaining crime-free and productive in the community. Issues of major importance to recently released inmates are employment, housing and adjustment to community standards. Staff works with clients in order to remove these barriers and assist in their adjustment. Short-term case management services are provided that assist clients with emergency needs, community stabilization, and general assistance in becoming productive citizens in the community.

Project Reunion, a program of the Resource Center, is a parenting skills program designed to address the serious problems experienced by women and their children when they are separated by incarceration or court order due to abuse or neglect. The goal of this program is to maintain and/or strengthen the parent/child relationship. Services consist of parenting skills training, structured parent/child visitation, feedback sessions and supportive services to the children and their caregivers. The program is available to female inmates at the Middlesex County Adult Corrections Center (MCACC) and women in the community who have been referred by DYFS, Family Court or other relevant agencies. Resource Center staff transports children to the MCACC or agency from which the referral originated on a weekly basis.

NJ Helps knows about the programs listed below. NJ Helps can tell you whether your family might be able to get help from any of these programs. Click on the program name for a description of the program. Click on the "Continue" button to begin to screen for eligibility.

These Centers are located within counties and are funded to provide information about and assistance related to employment and supportive services. There are often multiple One Stop Career Centers in a county. Below, you will find the location of Centers in your home county and a description of the services they provide.

Note: These One Stop Career Centers are information resources, not employment centers. People who visit these Centers often express frustration with the limited assistance they provide and by their limited information about specific job opportunities. Do NOT expect that these Centers will help you find a job. Use these Centers to get information. Then, use the information to find yourself a job. Remember that community-based programs often look better on paper than they act in practice.

Federal Bonding Program (<http://www.bonds4jobs.com/>)

What Is Fidelity Bonding?

- Insurance to protect employer against employee dishonesty
- Covers any type of stealing: theft, forgery, larceny, and embezzlement
- In effect, a guarantee of worker job honesty
- An incentive to the employer to hire an at-risk job applicant
- A unique tool for marketing applicants to employers
- DOES NOT cover ‘liability’ due to poor workmanship, job injuries, work accidents, etc.
- Is NOT a bail bond or court bond needed in adjudication
- Is NOT a bond needed for self-employment (contract bond, license bond or performance bond)

Why Is Fidelity Bonding Needed for Job Placement?

- Employers view ex-offenders and other at-risk job seekers as potentially untrustworthy workers, thereby, denying them job-hire
- Insurance companies will not cover risky job applicants under commercial Fidelity Bonds purchased by employers to protect themselves against employee dishonesty
- Anyone who has ever “committed a fraudulent or dishonest act” is deemed NOT BONDABLE by insurance companies, a situation leading to routine denial of employment opportunities for such persons
- Being NOT BONDABLE is a significant barrier to employment possessed by the hardest-to-place job applicants; this barrier can be eliminated only by The Federal Bonding Program
- Job bonding enables the employer to “obtain worker skills without taking risk”
- Persons who are NOT BONDABLE can ultimately become commercially BONDABLE by demonstrating job honesty during the 6 months of bond coverage under the Federal Bonding Program (such commercial bonding will be made available by the Travelers Casualty and Surety Company of America; referred to hereafter as TRAVELERS)

Who Is Eligible for Bonding Services?

- Any at-risk job applicant is eligible for bonding services, including: ex-offenders, recovering substance abusers (alcohol or drugs), welfare recipients and other persons having poor financial credit, economically disadvantaged youth and adults who lack a work history, individuals dishonorably discharged from the military, and others
- Anyone who cannot secure employment without bonding
- All persons bonded must meet the legal working age set by the State in which the job exists
- Self-employed persons are NOT ELIGIBLE for bonding services (bondee must be an employee who earns wages with Federal taxes automatically deducted from paycheck)

- Bonds can be issued to cover already employed workers who need bonding in order to (a) prevent being laid off, or (b) secure a transfer or promotion to a new job at the company
- Bonding coverage can apply to any job at any employer in any State

Individuals Seeking Bonding

The Federal Bonding Program provides fidelity bonding for the first six months of employment for hard-to-place job applicants. If you are seeking bonding services and/or a job you should call the following toll-free number for (1.) the location of the workforce office/one-stop center nearest your home and, (2.) the telephone number of the State Bonding Coordinator for your state. In those states without a state bonding coordinator, callers will be referred to the nearest career center/ one-stop center for employment assistance.

On-The-Job Training (OJT)

OJT is a subsidized employment opportunity that includes training. This exciting program is designed to assist eligible New Jersey job seekers find employment.

OJT has a proven track record of meeting the needs of both job seeker and employer. You would be hired by a private or public employer and receive training that provides knowledge and skills essential to perform the job adequately. If you make satisfactory progress during this training period, you will be retained by the employer as a regular employee.

Work Opportunity Tax Credit (WOTC) Program

This is a one year federal program which offers tax incentives for employers to hire individuals from certain targeted groups, such as: low-income and/or welfare individuals, ex-felons, individuals with disabilities, veterans who have received food stamps, and summer youth Hiring workers from any of the targeted groups can earn an employer a WOTC of up to \$2,400 for the first year of employment. The number of new hires who can qualify employers for these tax credits is unlimited. The WOTC replaces the Targeted Job Tax Credit (TJTC).

Qualifications:

Any physical or mental impairment that is a substantial impediment to employment may qualify an individual for vocational rehabilitation services.

Client Services:

1. Vocational Counseling & Guidance – Providing assistance to the consumer in handling the job search issues that impact employability, job maintenance strategies, and developing the overall techniques needed to be successful in a work environment.
2. Placement Services - Development of job leads both with and for the consumer and support during the job search; could include On the Job Training (OJT), Supported Employment (SE) or Time Limited -Placement and Coaching (TLPC)
3. Job Seeking Skills - Guidance in work search activities such as resume writing, interviewing skills, job search organization
4. Supported Employment - Through referral to an SE provider, one-on-one assistance in job searching, interviewing, applying for jobs; followed by coaching on the job to facilitate learning job duties and adjusting to the work environment; followed by periodic follow-up to ensure job retention
5. Time Limited Placement and Coaching - The first two categories of Supported Employment Services without periodic follow-along
6. Job Accommodations - Guidance on changing the worksite's physical environment or adding equipment that will allow an individual to do more work tasks independently, effectively, and safely
7. Skills Training - Vocational school, technology or trade School, business school, etc.
8. College Training - 2 or 4 year programs leading to a degree
9. Physical Restoration - Equipment or therapies which improve physical or cognitive functioning so that a person is able to work; examples could be physical, occupational, or speech therapy; cognitive therapy which includes those modalities; prosthetics or orthotics such as artificial limbs, braces, special shoes, hearing aides, and eyeglasses (in some instances)
10. Emotional Restoration Services – Short-term individual, group or other types of counseling to reduce symptoms of mental health problems and improve work-tolerance and the ability to get and keep a job.
11. Mobility Equipment
12. Driver Training - Assessment of driving ability and equipment needed to drive safely; assistance in purchasing driver training lessons if needed to reach a specific work goal.

13. Vehicle Modification

14. Home Modifications – services if needed to reach a specific work goal

Service Cost:

- **No Cost Services**

Diagnostic evaluation, vocational counseling and guidance, job placement, supported employment services, on-the-job training, job coaching, and work adjustment training in a community rehabilitation program are services provided at no cost to the consumer.

- **Services with Cost**

Expenses for medical services, training, books, supplies, tools, and equipment are based on an individual's ability to pay. DVRS financial criteria are less restrictive than those of many other agencies. Counselors are required to locate "comparable benefits", that is, identical services available from other sources.

Note: DVRS cannot pay for services and costs an individual incurred prior to being determined eligible.

This nationally recognized, post-secondary training is competency-based and/or time-based, industry-driven for a vast range of occupations. Any employer can sponsor employees who work on a full time basis. A sponsor's training standards are not dictated by a government agency. Union and non-union apprenticeship programs are available. Having skilled worker is critical to the success of any enterprise. Implementing registered apprenticeship programs can ensure that workforce talent is continually replenished and is educated and skilled in accordance with the needs of an enterprise.

What are the benefits to the sponsor? Registered Apprenticeship:

- Decreases employee turnover.
- Enhances problem-solving capabilities and versatility of the workforce.
- Enhances employee relations by developing a collaborative commitment to achievement.
- Attracts high-quality applicants who are motivated to succeed.

Apprenticeship Training Programs range from one to six years in duration, depending upon occupation and job title. Candidates must be employed on a full time basis; in a specific trade related to the training they intend to enter. Approved training programs are established through the Apprenticeship Coordinator. Morris County School of Technology, the NJ State Department of Labor and the US Department of Labor award Certificates of Completion, upon meeting all requirements of the Training Program. For New Jersey employers in manufacturing, the NJ Department of Labor offers a Registered Apprenticeship [monetary] Incentive Program. Apprentices receive a minimum of 2000 hours per year of on-the-job training by the sponsor. At Morris County School of Technology, Apprentices attend related instruction classes two to three evenings per week from September through May. Sponsors ensure that the Apprentice's work schedule does not interfere with class sessions, which usually run from 6:30 p.m. to 9:30 p.m.

HOUSING

Housing assistance is provided by federal, state, local governments and community groups. It is important to understand what assistance is provided by government and community agencies **and** whether your conviction prevents you from accessing types of assistance.

In general, public housing assistance (Section 8 housing) is NOT available to people convicted of a felony conviction within the past five years. Some people are permanently ineligible for public housing. These include anyone the housing authority believes is using drugs, subject to state sex offender registration laws, or convicted of manufacturing methamphetamines on public housing property. People with recent felony convictions may NOT live in Section 8 housing occupied by family or friends without putting them at risk of eviction.

Private landlords can legally ask you about your past criminal history, can and do conduct background checks prior to renting, and can decline renting to you because of your felony conviction. Hiding your background is harder now with electronic background checking and if withheld, it can be grounds for eviction.

Residential Health Care Facilities in Morris County

Residential Health Care Facilities Licensed by The Department of Health and of Health and Senior Services:

Residential Health Care Facilities are licensed by the State Department of Health and Senior Services. "Resident" means a person who is 18 years of age or over, mobile under his or her own power, with or without assistive devices and able to effectuate his or her own evacuation from the building where they reside. A licensed physician must certify that the resident does not have medical or personal care needs which exceed the level of services provided in a residential health care facility, is free from communicable diseases (that is, does not have a reportable, communicable disease which is not controlled through prophylaxis or medication), and does not require skilled nursing care.

The main purpose of this level of care is that it provides for many individuals (who are primarily elderly) and their families, a delivery system that allows for a home-like atmosphere, while maintaining continuous supervision of health care and daily activity needs. This atmosphere encourages independence for as long as possible, while assuring safety.

Licensed Residential Health Care Facilities provide the following services:

- 24-hour supervision
- Provision of assistance with personal hygiene, management of funds for clothing and other purchases and supervision of all medications.
- Health Maintenance and Monitoring Services include assessment of medical, social, and health history needs and corresponding plans to meet those needs. (Registered Nurse).
- Dietary Services.
- Arrangements for activity participation in and outside the facility.

HEALTH AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Medicaid provides medical assistance programs to individuals who are both categorically and financially eligible. Medicaid categories are limited to very low income families with dependent children, pregnant women, children to age 21, individuals age 65 and older, or individuals determined blind or permanently disabled. Individuals must be residents of New Jersey and they are required to be a citizen of the United States or be lawfully admitted for permanent residence for at least five years. Pregnant women and children and other qualified aliens may be exempt from the 5 year requirement. The financial requirements vary for each program. Medicaid eligibility can be utilized in conjunction with other community programs and waivers as well as nursing home placement for senior and disabled individuals.

Individuals that may not qualify for Medicaid programs can explore alternatives such as:

The Medically Needy segment of New Jersey Care...Special Medicaid Programs which provides limited coverage to aged, blind or disabled individuals who do not qualify for other Medicaid programs due to excess income or resources. This program features a spend down provision in which documented medical expenses can be used to reduce monthly income to meet the program limits. More information would be available at the local County Welfare or Board of Social Services agency.

New Jersey Hospital Care Payment Assistance Program, provides free or reduced-charge care to patients who receive inpatient and outpatient services at NJ acute care hospitals. For more information contact 1-800-367-6543 or the business office of the local hospital.

Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC) provide limited health care services to clients on a sliding scale basis. For more information about FQHCs, locations and services, access their website at njpca.org or call 609-275-8886.

SOCIAL SECURITY PROGRAMS

Social Security Card

Applications for social security cards are processed by your local Social Security office. You can process the application by mail or in person.

Medicare Benefits

Your Medicare card will come in the mail up to three months before your 65th birthday. If you do not receive it in a timely manner, you should call the Social Security Administration at 1-800-772-1213 or visit them on the internet at www.ssa.gov. Either way, you will get assistance and can have the Medicare card sent to you.

If you are not receiving Social Security, you will need to sign up for Medicare. This is an easy process and you can do this a couple of ways. You can call Social Security Administration at 1-800-772-1213. They will take the information over the phone to get the process underway and then they will send you some paperwork in the mail.

If you prefer, you can go to your local Social Security office and apply in person. The advantage to this is that there is an individual there who will walk you through the entire process. Either way, it is your choice. You cannot sign up on line for Medicare only.

To sign up for both Medicare and Social Security Retirement Benefits together you can apply online at www.ssa.gov, or by phone at 1-800-772-1213, or go in person to your local Social Security office. Either way, you should be able to easily get enrolled for Medicare benefits without extra effort or worry.

Disability Benefits

Social Security Disability (SSDI) applications are processed in person at a local Social Security office, by telephone, mail, or over the Internet. Supplemental Security Income (SSI) applications are processed only at the local Social Security office. A large amount of paper work is involved in completing a SSDI or SSI application. Making an appointment at the local office is advised. After filing an application, it takes, on average, three to five months to determine whether you were approved. For more information on how to apply for SSDI or SSI or to get your claim started, visit the Social Security Disability web site,

Applications for SSDI or SSI require proof of disability and SSI requires proof of income need. Qualification for either program provides health insurance through Medicaid or Medicare.

People are not eligible for either SSDI or SSI while in jail or prison. SSI applications can be processed within 30 days of release. Along with an SSI application, applicants must complete a Statement of Claimant (SSA 795), which asks: do you have any outstanding warrants and if on parole/probation, are you in violation. Answering 'yes' to either question must be addressed before the application will be processed.

Applications for Social Security Disability (SSDI, SSI) in New Jersey are processed by local Social Security offices. From the list below, find the one closest to you and call

first to make sure that that office serves your area. Applying for SSDI or SSI is as simple as calling the 800 number and making an appointment at one of these local offices. If you have difficulty getting to the office it can be done by making a phone appointment.

WorkFirst New Jersey (WFNJ)

The state's welfare reform program, WorkFirst NJ, emphasizes work as the first step toward building a new life and a brighter future. Our goal is to help people get off welfare, secure employment and become self-sufficient, through job training, education and work activities.

WFNJ provides temporary cash assistance and many other support services to families through the *Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)* program.

New Jersey is one of only a few states that also provide cash benefits and support services to individuals and couples with no dependent children, through our *General Assistance (GA)* program.

Services under WFNJ are limited to five years. After that, clients may be eligible for the [Supportive Assistance to Individuals and Families \(SAIF\) program.](#)

Under the supervision of the NJ Division of Family Development (DFD), the 21 county welfare agencies administer the TANF program. These agencies also administer the WorkFirst NJ General Assistance (GA) program - which provides welfare services for individuals and couples without children -in most cases, although about one-third of New Jersey's 566 municipalities maintain their own welfare offices to serve those clients. NOTE: If you were convicted of an offense involving distribution or sale of drugs after August 22, 1996, you cannot receive cash benefits under GA or TANF. If you were convicted of an offense after that date that only involved possession of drugs, you may be able to get benefits if you completed or are enrolled in a licensed drug treatment program, or completed a program in prison and are drug free (you will have to submit to drug testing).

If you apply for welfare and the case worker asks about your criminal background, you should answer truthfully and to the best of your knowledge. If you lie, you may be found ineligible and could also be prosecuted.

The state also provides financial assistance and services to people who cannot work, due to a disability or other reason. People who are disabled may qualify for the federal [Supplemental Security Income](#) (SSI) program.

Supplemental Security Income (SSI)

The Federal Social Security Administration administers the Supplemental Security Income (SSI) Program, under which persons age 65 years and older, or those who are blind or disabled (including children); receive maintenance payments from that agency and supportive services (including emergency assistance and payment for burial) through the county welfare agencies. For eligible individuals, a state supplement is provided in order to increase the net countable income up to the state standard for the respective living arrangement. In addition, there can be instances of persons residing in title XIX (Nursing Home) facilities who receive a \$40 personal need allowance.

Legal Services/SSI Initiative

Work First NJ (WFNJ) recipients who may be eligible for federal SSI benefits can now get free legal help. The Division of Family Development has established an agreement with Legal Services of New Jersey (LSNJ) to assist these recipients in either filing for SSI benefits or appealing a denial of benefits.

The project primarily targets WFNJ recipients who currently receive a medical deferral from work requirements for at least 12 months, or those who are participating in the Emergency Assistance Pilot for the Long-Term Chronically Impaired.

Food Stamps

Provide a monthly sum to buy food. If you were convicted after August 22, 1996 of a drug distribution or sales offense, you may still be able to get Food Stamps if you have completed or are enrolled in a licensed drug treatment program, or completed a program in prison and are drug free (you will be tested). The same goes for possession offenses.

Veterans Benefits

If you were receiving veteran's benefits, either for disability or a pension, and you were incarcerated for more than 60 days, you will have to get reinstated after you are released.

If you were not receiving benefits and you are a veteran, you may be eligible for benefits or for some of their other programs and services, including health care. You can contact the VA for questions about benefits at 1-800-827-1000; the health benefit number is 1-877-222-VETS. The New Jersey Office of the Public Defender provides constitutionally mandated legal representation for adults and juveniles charged with criminal offenses who are unable to afford private lawyers. Once you have been found by the court to be eligible for public defender services, you are guaranteed certain rights as a public defender client. You also have certain responsibilities as a client including an obligation to pay reasonable costs of your representation.

Once the court has decided that you do not have enough money to hire your own lawyer, and that you are therefore entitled to the services of a New Jersey Public Defender, you have the following responsibilities:

- Pay a \$50 administrative fee. This fee is payable at the time of your initial meeting with a public defender lawyer or investigator. It may be paid by check or money order (made out to the Office of the Public Defender) or in cash. If you are unable to pay, a deferred payment schedule can be arranged.
- Meet as soon as possible with your lawyer. Discuss with the lawyer the facts and circumstances surrounding the charges against you. Your recollection of the events can be vital to your defense.
- Make a commitment to assist your lawyer in gathering all necessary documents and other information that may help your case. Remember that all communications--written or oral--with police, prosecutors, the probation 51 department, inmates or anyone else in the criminal justice system should be made through your lawyer.
- Advise your lawyer of your current residence. You must notify your lawyer or your county public defender office of any change in your address or phone number during the course of your representation.
- In addition to the administrative fee, you must by law pay the Office of the Public Defender for the reasonable costs of defender services once your case is completed. Public defender fees are for work such as interviews and investigations done outside the courtroom, plus other costs such as those for transcripts and expert witnesses. If you cannot pay the full amount at one time, a payment schedule can be arranged. Periodic bills will be sent to you until all costs are paid. The office also is required by law to place liens on your property to meet unpaid bills. State income tax refunds and Homestead rebates also can be withheld after two-years, under the Set-Off Individual Liability (SOIL) program. You will be required to sign a reimbursement form which signifies your agreement to pay these costs; however, failure to sign this form does not relieve you of your obligation to reimburse the Office of the Public Defender.

FOOD AND CLOTHING

Many communities contain food and clothing resources that assist individuals and families on a regular basis. It is important when visiting these resource facilities to come prepared with the proper required documents. Many request proof of residency, income, identification and/or a letter of referral. Listed below are examples of documents often accepted to satisfy eligibility requirements.

Proof or Identification:

Drivers License or Identification Card; Passport; Birth Certificate; Social Security Card; Naturalization Certificate; Official Hospital/Doctor Birth Records; Marriage Records; Documentation of Recent Incarceration

Proof of Residency:

**Avoid Using Proof of Residency Documents with a PO Box Address*

Leasing Contract or Mortgage Statement; Utility Bill (Gas, Electric, Cable); Drivers License or Identification Card; Bank Statement; Postmarked Envelope, Postcard, or Magazine

Proof of Income:

Recent Paycheck Stub; Letter from Employer on Company Letterhead (Signed and Dated); Income Tax Return; Letter from Department of Labor; Documentation of Recent Incarceration; Unemployment Record;

Proof or Identification:

Drivers License or Identification Card; Passport; Birth Certificate; Social Security Card; Naturalization Certificate; Official Hospital/Doctor Birth Records; Marriage Records; Documentation of Recent Incarceration

How to Acquire a Referral:

A simple way to prove need for social services is to contact the local county Department of Social Services. There is a directory of all of New Jersey's Department of Social Services Offices listed within the *Community 101 Resource Binder*. The Department will provide you with documentation accepted many places to verify eligibility for local resources.

Also, many resource locations accept referral letters from any social services agency, churches, schools (if you have children), and counselors. If a Food Bank/Pantry requires a referral, call and ask them about who else they accept letters from.

Note: If You Need to Receive Services Others

Many food pantries request that you provide additional documentation if you need to acquire food or clothing resources for additional family members, such as children, who live with you. This includes social security cards or birth certificates of each person/child.

Trip purposes include Medicaid covered medical appointments, housing assistance, emergency assistance, administrative fair hearings and employment and training requirements. Trips outside of Middlesex County are provided with proper medical documentation and/or approval from the Medicaid District Office. As an option, transportation reimbursement is available to individuals using their own vehicles and/or public transportation. General Assistance (GA) recipients who live in Perth Amboy, Plainsboro, South Brunswick (Dayton, Deans, Kendall Park, Kingston, Monmouth Junction), and Woodbridge (Avenel, Colonia, Fords, Hopelawn, Iselin, Keasbey, Menlo Park Terrace, Port Reading, Sewaren, Woodbridge Town) must contact their Local Welfare Dept for transportation.

The Transportation Unit provides customer service to assist all Middlesex County residents with various informational transit resources available locally. It is a continued effort to promote concepts of efficiency and economy without jeopardizing quality of care when scheduling and providing necessary transportation services. 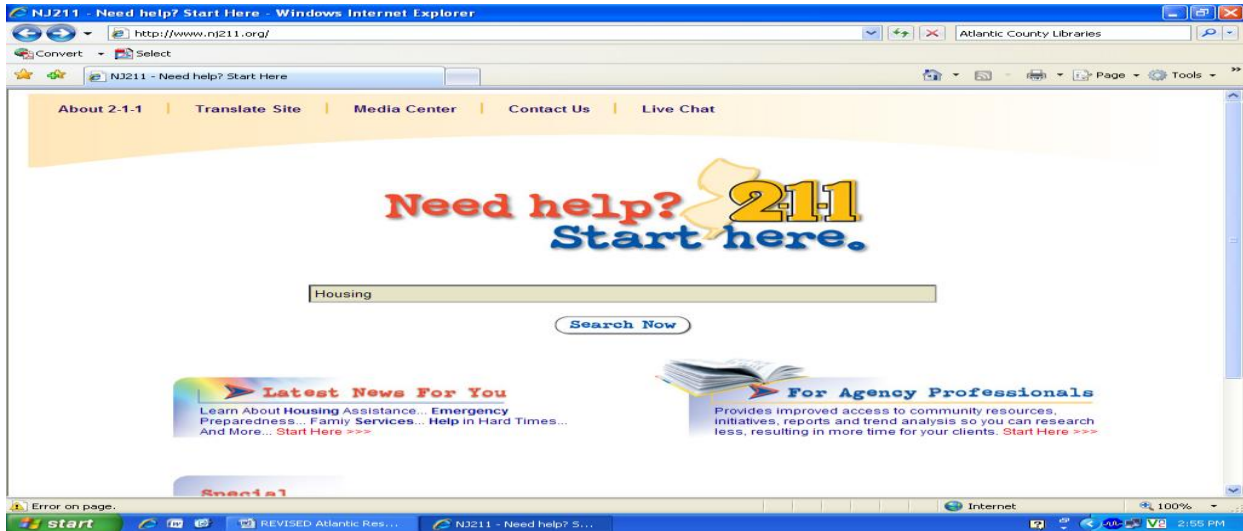

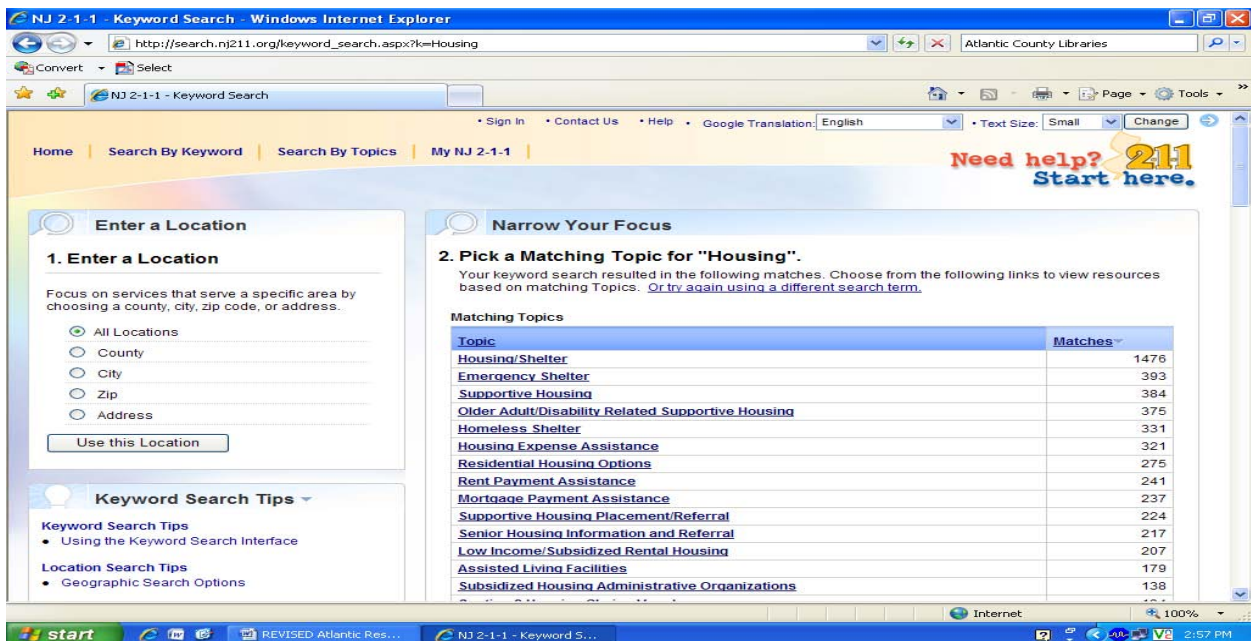

B. EDUCATION

How to Qualify for a New Jersey High School Diploma

There are different ways to qualify for a New Jersey State-endorsed High School Diploma:

Take and successfully pass the GED by (1) earning the minimum passing score on each of the tests; and, (2) earning a total score of 225.

To qualify for a local district diploma, attend an adult high school and graduate.

Adult high schools offer adults the opportunity to obtain a high school diploma. Adult high schools are schools offering supervised instruction in the day or evening to allow adults to complete the requirements for a locally issued state-endorsed diploma. Students are held accountable for the Statewide assessment in effect at the time they meet all other graduation requirements.

Courses are varied to meet the educational needs of adults. For each student in an adult high school program, an educational plan is developed reflecting:

1. Past academic record;
2. An analysis of past experiences for which credit may be awarded;
3. Graduation requirements; and
4. A proposed schedule of courses leading to completion of the requirements for graduation

How to Prepare for the GED Test

There are many ways to help you prepare for the GED test.

Enroll in a free local adult education program. Your academic strengths and will be assessed to determine if you are ready to take the GED test or if you need more instruction.

If you cannot attend a local program, tune in to the GED on TV broadcast on the New Jersey Network, two times a day, from 5:30am-6:00am and 1:30-2:00pm. The program is aired in English on Monday, Tuesday, Saturday, and Sunday; and in Spanish on Wednesday and Thursday. *If you are interested in the GED on TV program, call 1-800-345-7587.*

Guide to Affordable Housing in New Jersey

How to Use the Guide

This is a directory of Affordable housing developments in New Jersey. It does not include all affordable units, only those built under certain federal or State initiatives. The apartments and houses in this guide are listed in alphabetical order by county. Each county section lists the official name of the municipality where the developments are located. The name in the guide is the formal name of the political jurisdiction. (For example, Kendall Park is a place name for an area in a municipality known by the formal name South Brunswick Township, Middlesex County.) The proper municipal names appear in this Guide in alphabetical order.

Under the column heading "development/aka" is the name of the development. The "aka" refers to "also known as" and shows other names the developments may go by or once had. The next three columns are street address, municipality, and zip code.

For some developments with many street addresses, the phrase "scattered sites" appears. Other types of housing serve people with special needs, physical or mental disabilities. These include shelters, transitional housing, group homes, supervised apartments, nursing homes, and assisted-living complexes. The people who live there have medical or other special needs. Due to the sensitive nature of this type of housing, the phrase "intentional blank" may appear as the street address.

Again, "municipality" refers to the formal name of the political jurisdiction where the housing is located.

These are site addresses, not mailing addresses. Sometimes they are one and the same, but not always. A mailing address can be a local place name or a postal address, but the guide shows only the official name of the local political jurisdiction that is the site of the development.

Whether or not the development serves a specific group of people is indicated under the column heading "type." There are several housing types. "Family" units are unrestricted and open to any household that meets the income limits. "Senior" describes age-restricted dwellings. Generally, you must be 62 years or older to live in these facilities. "Sr/disabled" units are for the aged or infirm. "Disabled" refers to units for people with medical or physical impairments. These include group homes for the developmentally disabled administered by the county Association for Retarded Citizens (ARC). "Both" indicates the developments have a mix of housing for families, as well as seniors or people with disabilities. "Special hsg" refers to shelters, transitional housing, nursing homes, or other housing for people with special hsg" refers to shelters, transitional housing, nursing homes, or other housing for people with special needs. Under "**tenure**," you will find if the units are for rent or for sale.

The next column, "**agent**," has a contact for the development. Sometimes this is an owner or developer. Other times it is a property manager, government agency, or a representative from a church or nonprofit organization.

Agents have more specific information on the availability of housing and the process you must go through to rent or buy. Their telephone numbers follow. Many developments have the Housing Affordability Service (HAS) in the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs as a rental or sale agent. You may want to begin your search with the HAS because it represents so many developments in the State. The telephone number is (609)278-7505. This agency will send you an application form, or you can download one from their Web Site.

The last column in the directory is very important. It shows an abbreviated name of the program or programs that fund the developments. You need to know a little about them because they set the rules that determine whether you qualify to live in the development.

Blanks in the directory indicate information was not available at the time of publication. Sometimes the information changes or is incorrect. If you come across mistakes or find information that is missing, please contact John Lago at the Department of Community Affairs at (609) 292-7898.

Program Descriptions

Federal or State programs fund most of the housing in this Guide. Nearly all of the developments have income restrictions, and federal and State programs have different income guidelines. Income standards vary by county and household size. Most of the housing must be affordable to households with moderate or low incomes. Low-income households earn 50 percent or less than the median family income for the county where the affordable development is located. Moderate-income households earn between 50 and 80 percent of the county median. Some federal programs give priority to extremely low-income households with earnings at or below 30 percent of median county income. Some programs serve households at or below 60 percent of median, which is why these figures appear in the federal standards.

Keep in mind most developments have waiting lists. Don't be discouraged. Program rules may give housing administrators some flexibility to help families meeting certain conditions, such as the loss of a home, substandard living conditions, or burdensome rents. Because need is a factor, you may get housing in a short period of time.

Rental agents and program administrators have more details about the programs listed below. These descriptions are provided to give you a general overview.

Public Housing

The largest group of affordable units in this Guide is public housing. Housing authorities administer this federal program. New Jersey has about 100 housing authorities. A list appears in Appendix A.

Housing authorities get federal funds to build and run public housing developments. Most have rental units, but some have houses for sale. Rents and sale prices depend on household income and can be no more than 30 percent of adjusted earnings. People who live in public housing earn less than 80 percent of median family income. Federal rules require housing authorities to keep a certain percentage of these units for very low-income households, earning 50 percent or less than median family income. Some housing authorities must reserve units for extremely low-income households with earnings at or below 30 percent of median. Use federal income standards to determine eligibility.

Housing authorities may have waiting lists. This depends on local conditions. Public housing authorities may give priority to people who live or work in the communities they serve. The people who operate these authorities are an excellent resource. They know the local housing market and are aware of other programs and opportunities that might be available. This is why a good place to start your search is with your local housing authority.

Section 8

Section 8 rental assistance from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) comes in two varieties: tenant-based and project-based assistance. Both help low- and moderate-income households pay affordable rents, which are defined as no more than 30 percent of adjusted income on shelter and utility costs. The amount of subsidy covers any excess costs. Use federal income standards to determine eligibility.

Section 8 tenant-based assistance, known as a housing choice, voucher, or certificate program, is extremely important. Nationally and in New Jersey, it is one of the largest sources of housing assistance, helping the greatest number of households. But because vouchers are tied to people, not buildings, they cannot be listed in a directory, such as this Guide. Still, this is a vital source of assistance. In New Jersey, many public housing authorities have housing voucher programs. A list appears in Appendix A. The authorities shown with an asterisk have voucher programs. The New Jersey Department of Community Affairs also has Section 8 vouchers. For more information, contact the field offices shown in Appendix B.

HMFA

The New Jersey Housing and Mortgage Finance Agency (HMFA) has many housing programs funded from the sale of bonds. Some provide mortgage assistance and closing costs to homebuyers. Others help homeowners repair the houses they have. While these are important initiatives, this type of assistance is not in the Guide. All HMFA developments shown in the Guide are multifamily apartments built with State assistance. Many also got Section 221 or Section 236 mortgage assistance from HUD. If a development received both HMFA and federal funds, use federal income standards. Otherwise, use State income standards. Low- and moderate-income households qualify for HMFA-funded developments. For more information on HMFA's homebuyer or rehabilitation programs call (609) 278-7400. Those looking to buy a house or condominium should consider calling HMFA to see about the availability of homebuyer assistance programs. The agency has a mortgage hotline: 1-800-NJ-HOUSE, or 1-800-654-6873.

Tax Credits

Enacted in 1986, this federal program provides tax benefits to private and nonprofit developers of affordable apartments. At least 20 percent of the units must be affordable to people with earnings at or below 50 percent of median county income; 40 percent must be affordable to those with income at or below 60 percent of the county median, as defined by the federal guidelines.

Urban Home Ownership Recovery Program (UHORP)

The Urban Home Ownership Recovery program is a State initiative administered by HMFA. It provides assistance to developers to help build for-sale housing for low- and moderate-income households, as defined by the State income standards.

Section 221 and Section 236

These two federal programs provided below-market-rate mortgages to private and nonprofit developers of rental housing for low- and moderate-income families, as defined by the federal income standards.

Section 202 and Section 811

Both of these federal programs fund special-need housing. The 202 program is for elderly residents 62 years of age or older, while the 811 program serves residents 18 years of age or over with a physical or developmental disability or a chronic mental illness. Most of these

developments are for low-income households, through a smaller number are reserved for moderate-income families, as defined by the federal standards.

Section 207, 213, 223, and 231

Some of the developments in the guide were built under these sections of national housing legislation. These programs may have units available to low-and moderate-income families. Use the federal standard to determine eligibility.

HOME

The HOME Improvement Partnership program (HOME) is a federal program that supports housing rehabilitation and production. HOME funds go to states and local governments and can be used for a variety of purposes, including rental assistance, housing production and rehabilitation, and first-time homebuyer programs. Eligibility may be extended to households with incomes at or below 60 percent of median county income.

Farm Home

Sometimes referred to as the 515 multi-family rental programs, "Farm Home" is a federal program administered by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Farmers Home Administration. The multifamily housing program provides assistance to for-profit and nonprofit developers of rental units in small towns and rural areas. These developments are affordable to family and senior households with low or moderate incomes. Federal income standards apply.

The New Jersey Department of Community Affairs administers the Balanced Housing program, which supports both housing rehabilitation and production. Only those newly built or substantially rehabilitated units funded under this State program appear in the guide. If a Balanced Housing development also received federal aid, use federal income standards to determine eligibility. Otherwise, use the State income standards.

MtL

This abbreviation stands for "Mount Laurel" development. MtL housing can exist anywhere in New Jersey. It gets its name from the south Jersey municipality sued for having zoning laws that limited the supply of affordable housing. The New Jersey Supreme Court ruled all municipalities have a constitutional obligation to have zoning laws that meet their fair share of regional affordable housing needs. MtL housing is so designated by localities themselves or by the Council on Affordable Housing (COAH), a State agency created to help towns adopt housing plans that meet present and future housing needs.

Mount Laurel housing covers a wide range of housing. The units may be for sale or rent. They can be for the elderly, disabled, or families and may be funded by any one of the federal or State programs described above. Some Mount Laurel developments, however, get no public subsidy. Developers build them as part of market-rate developments. Some MtL units are funded by regional contribution agreements (RCAs) whereby a community agrees to provide assistance to another to meet regional housing need. All Mount Laurel units have income restrictions and must be affordable to low-and moderate-income households. If federal funds were used to finance these developments, use federal guidelines to determine eligibility. If State programs financed these developments or if they are part of a market-rate development with no federal subsidy at all, use State income standards

TOP 10 QUESTIONS TO ASK A LANDLORD

In a hot renters' market, people feel pressured to sign up quickly to avoid losing out on the apartment they want. Avoid giving in to pressure when you're considering an apartment. While the landlord is asking you questions, be sure to ask him/her questions on your own.

1. When will the apartment be available?
2. What is the monthly rent? Does it include utilities? If so, which ones?
3. How long is the lease, and what are the terms for lease renewal?
4. What is the security deposit, and how much do I get back when I vacate the unit? (The maximum allowed for New Jersey is 1½ months.)
5. Can I have roommates? How many?
6. Where is the parking? Do I have an assigned space? Where do visitors park?
7. What type of security does the complex have in place? If the complex has a security gate with an access code, who gets the code (or key)?
8. What kind of maintenance do you have? Is there 24-hour access to maintenance personnel?
9. Can I have pets? What kind and how big? What is the pet deposit amount, and how much will I get back when I vacate?
10. What's is the policy regarding notice of lease renewal, rent increases, and entering the unit?

Remember that the landlord's verbal responses to these questions mean nothing unless they are put in writing either in the terms of the lease or added and initialed both by you and the landlord.
